We are completing our advanced unit on GEOMETRY next week...As usual, you can count on lots of critical thinking, real-world applications, and word problems! In addition, I will be having the students complete LOTS of IXL so I can easily tell when they completely understand the objectives. I HAVE SOME SPECIAL PLANS FOR THE LAST FEW WEEKS!

Math Ms. Jaya

Tigers:

Tigers worked on percent's in which they learnt to relate and compare fraction, decimals and percent's, percent of a number, calculate better buy, calculate sales tax, total cost, commission, discount, sale price and problem-solving applications. They also worked on calculating simple and compound interests. They will continue to work on measurements in which they will learn measure and compare different to customary units, calculate area, perimeter, surface area, and volume of different polygons. Some of the tigers are working on figuring out the relations and functions, linear equations in two variables, slope of a line, slope intercept form. We will also be wrapping up this year by reviewing all the concepts learnt.

Giraffes:

Giraffes worked on skip counting. They are now working on adding and subtracting numbers with and without regrouping, problem solving applications. Some of the giraffes are working on times tables and multiplying larger numbers and word problems using the concept learnt. They are also now working on finding out area and perimeter of squares and rectangles. We will be wrapping up this year with lots of reviews of learnt concepts. Continue to work on IXL.

Lions:

Lions worked on finding area, perimeter, circumference and volume of regular and irregular shapes, difference between similar and congruent figures and transformations, relate and convert between customary units of measurements. They are now working on ratio, proportion and percent's and then move on to basic algebra. Some of the lions completed working on decimals, in which they are learnt to solve decimal problems using different math operations. They are now working on basic algebra in which they will learn equations, missing numbers. Some of the lions are working on exponents, scientific notation, order of operations, translate and evaluate algebraic expressions. We will also continue to review previously learnt concepts.

Pandas:

Pandas were wonderful learning their multiplication and division facts. They are now working on geometry in which they are learning to find edges, vertices and faces of different polygons and move on to find the area and perimeter of different polygons. We are also working on learning multiplying 2 digit and 3-digit numbers by one digit number. Some of the Pandas are working on dividing larger numbers (long division with and without reminders), problem solving applications. We will also continue to practice the concepts learnt.

Upper Humanities

I had this identical sentiment last year. It is too often true that we fail to appreciate the life's blessings fully until difficulties place them front and center. The challenges we have all adapted to certainly made this relevant. Your amazing children are the blessing I see most as our school year nears its close. I want to thank all the parents for their patience and support during the year, and to share how very proud I am of the effort and adaptability of your children. Online instructional models are very different from in person learning, and the flexibility every student demonstrated as we bridged these varied needs helped tremendously.

I am working to keep all students actively and meaningfully engaged throughout the month. But I have always found this creates the perfect opportunity for students to actively apply what they've learned in the creation hands on products. That is my goal in the next few weeks.

Lions:

We have traveled the roads of ancient history together all semester, the path has led to the age of Rome. The extensive public speaking unit of Agora wrapped up as the May began. We will move on with a study of ancient Rome and the ways they added to Greek philosophy. The final project will combine what they learned with some engineering and architecture. They will have a chance to build their own devices for overcoming fortifications. It should be a fun combination of science and engineering in a historical context, with a bit of healthy competition. It will be a fun way to finish the year.

Tigers:

American history is about how ideas concerning the nature of government changed the world. Very few nations have placed the value of open and blunt verbal confrontation at the center of politics and power of the citizenry. We have examined the founding of America, exploring both strengths and mistakes, with the understanding that any human endeavor is fraught with human missteps. Learning our flaws reduces the tendency towards repetition. Words are the preferred weapons of combat in a society that values freedom. My goal has been to provide your child with a solid understanding of how this looks. We are closing this month with full blown Cross Examination format debate. In teams we will examine the principles of argumentation, policy debate, and the rhetorical strategies that form the basis for our legislative and justice systems. The kids are ready for a rumble!

What an amazing year it has been. Again, I want to thank all the parents for your support and blessing me with the opportunity to walk beside your children for a short while on their amazing journey in life. I wish blessings to you all as our national challenges continue and look forward to the next exciting steps together at Pinnacle Prep School.



Science

This month, our science classes finished up the geology of Earth and transitioned into the study of our Universe. We have studied the solar system and its cycles as well as the difference between astronomical units, and light-years. We have talked about the rotation of planets and how it can determine day/night cycles. We also reviewed how the revolution of Earth along with the tilt of its axis determines the seasons.

We are finishing with the night sky including the phases of the moon and how stars are classified and grouped in our sky. In addition, older students learn how stars are born, develop and finally die.

In the coming week, we are finishing the unit with galaxies, exoplanets, and space exploration (including a special project for Star Wars Day, May 4th). After that, we will delve into life cycles, ecology, and plants.

Along with all of this learning, we are taking time to do projects and activities that give students a chance to use what they have learned and apply it. May the Force Be with You and Yours this month!



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
