# Math

A hearty welcome to all the students! I'm absolutely thrilled to have each one of you in my class this year. I'm confident that by working together, we can turn this into a year of achievement and excellence. To start off, we'll be focusing on revisiting the math concepts you've already covered during the first couple of weeks. Let's embark on this journey of learning and growth together!

#### **Penguins:**

At the start of the year, penguins will begin to learn counting and matching numbers. They will also practice reading and writing numbers from 1 to 20.

#### **Giraffes:**

In the beginning of this year, giraffes will go over their addition and subtraction work. After that, they will begin learning about place value up to hundreds. During this, children will understand how to find the position and value of a number, and how to write the number in standard, expanded, and word forms.

#### Pandas:

As the year begins, pandas will go over the concepts they've already learned. They will then move on to exploring the position and value of numbers up to the ten-thousands place, as well as mastering the skill of representing a given number in standard, expanded, and word forms.

#### Lions:

Lions started this wonderful year by learning place value up to billions and decimals, estimating sums, differences, products and quotients and problem-solving strategies. Some of the lions will work on order of operations.

### Tigers:

The tigers are currently going over concepts they've learned before. They'll soon begin exploring Pre-Algebra ideas. A few of the tigers will be focusing on understanding place value up to billions, including decimals, and practicing how to write a given number in standard, expanded, and word forms.
